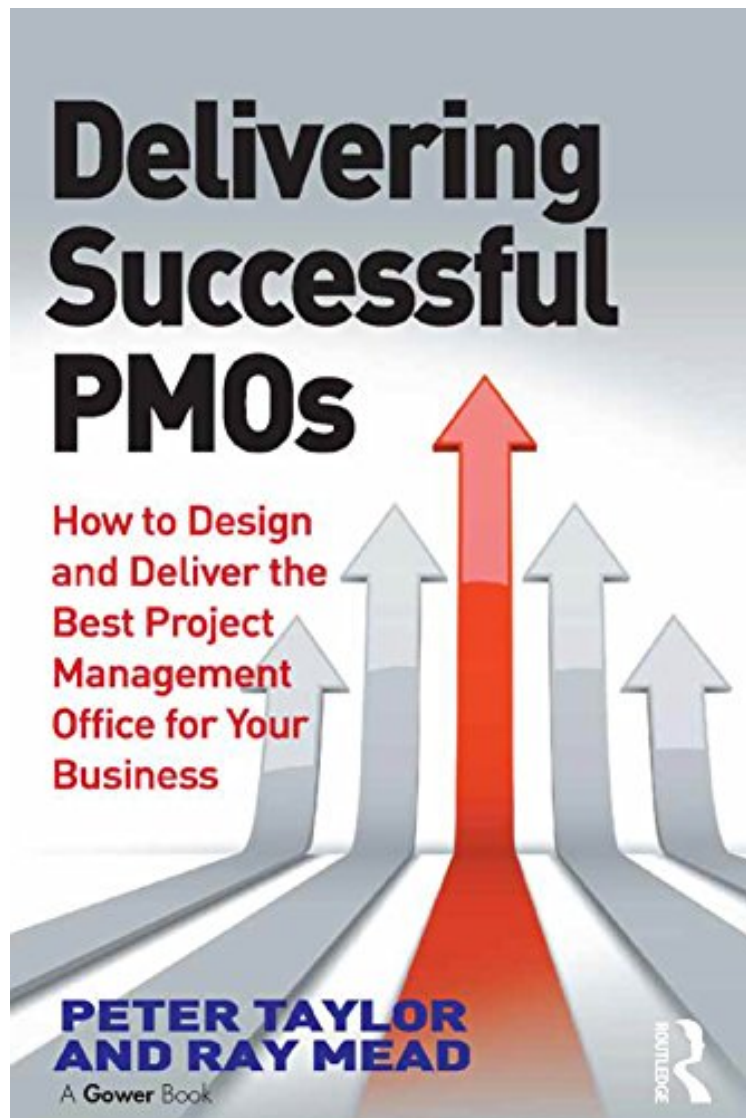


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Delivering Successful PMOs: How to Design and Deliver the Best Project Management Office for your Business
