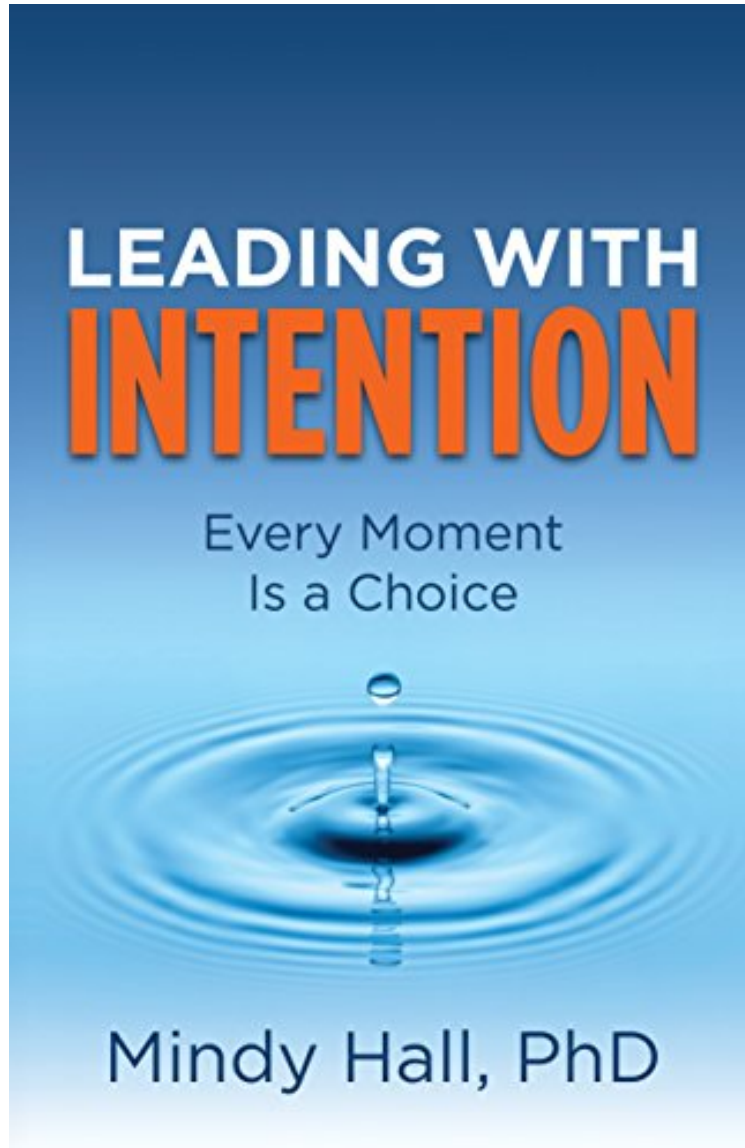

Recognizing our impact on others and consciously choosing how to shape that impact is not a particularly profound idea, but it is easily overlooked and readily forgotten as we frantically work to meet deadlines and complete tasks. Leading with Intention offers a timely reminder that everything we do shapes how others perceive us. While the ideas in the book are intriguing, the style of the book is challenging. It's too short. Each chapters is only a few pages.

It's almost too easy to read. I found that I had to go back and reread frequently. It was like reading somebody's lecture notes without the context of actually hearing the talk.
