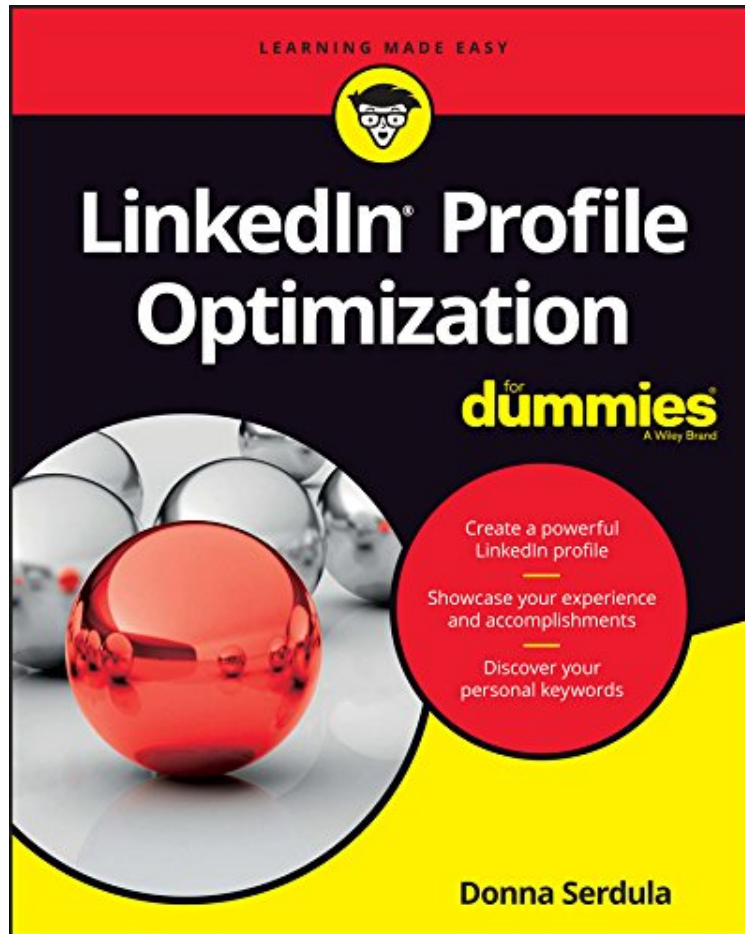

As a person who hates hearing business words like "leverage" and "optimize" bandied about endlessly and who also hates phrases like "It's a Google world" with equal passion, even I had to give Donna Serdula's "LinkedIn Profile Optimization For Dummies" five stars. It was a bit hard for me to stomach some of the more effusive reviews that described this "For Dummies" book as if it were written by Peter Drucker or something. But, after making changes to my own personal profile as I read though it I must admit: this really is a very good book. Serdula manages to break down sometimes

complex tasks into simple processes without being completely boring about it, though she does occasionally wander off track to soliloquize about it being a Google World (more than once, I'm sorry to say). Now about the timing. LinkedIn just revamped their interface at the beginning of 2017, and so many of Serdula's step by step instructions have been rendered somewhat inaccurate (tool bars not being in places she states they are, some described features apparently no longer existing, etc.). That being said, I still found most of what she was discussing after a short hunt, and so far all of her solutions have actually worked, once I had the right starting place. The LinkedIn face lift was not her fault, and the book is still five stars worth of useful, so I think she should still get five stars for the work overall. Suggested tweaks and polishes range from the small (like personalizing your URL so you don't look inept from the get-go) to the big (how to write that darn summary without sounding pompous), and while I didn't agree with some of the suggestions (like how public the average person's profile should be) there is a true wealth of info in here, especially for LinkedIn novices. I would consider myself in the middle range of LinkedIn users; not a total beginner but not a star network builder either. I already had an "Expert" profile (under the old LinkedIn interface, anyway) and I learned something new every few pages. Serdula's writing style is mostly clear and concise, with occasional touches of gentle humor. The information in the book is well-organized and flows logically--this is an easy book to get through in a weekend. And in the "For Dummies" series, that's the ultimate compliment.
