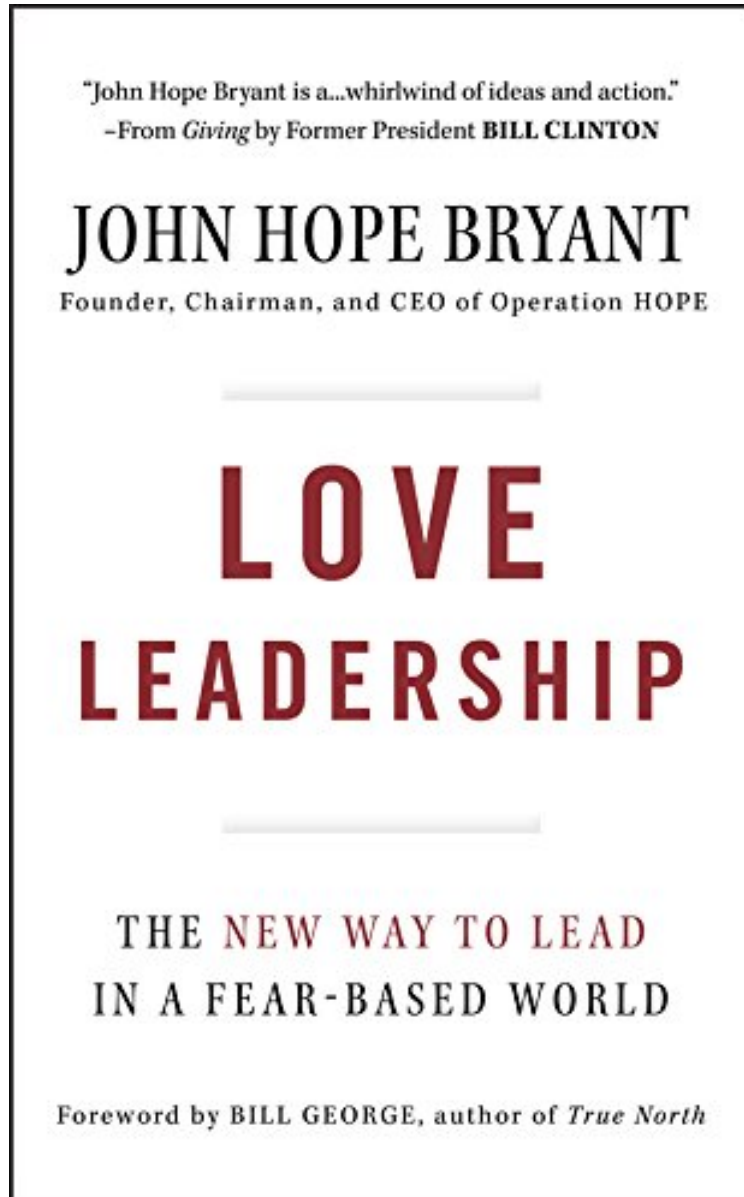

Over the years, I've read many management and leadership books, but none as "real" as this one. Rarely has a book about leadership been written in language that has such universal appeal, from entry-level to the C-suite, from leading in business to leading in the community. It's written in such a way that people on all levels can take away truly "actionable" thoughts from which they can make meaningful changes in their own lives as leaders. As I turned the pages, I thought not only about how I've led in the past and can improve immediately, but also about other leaders with whom I've worked in the past. There is not a doubt in my mind that Mr. Bryant's thoughts on what is more effective and what is less effective is completely consistent with my experiences in over 25 years of working.
