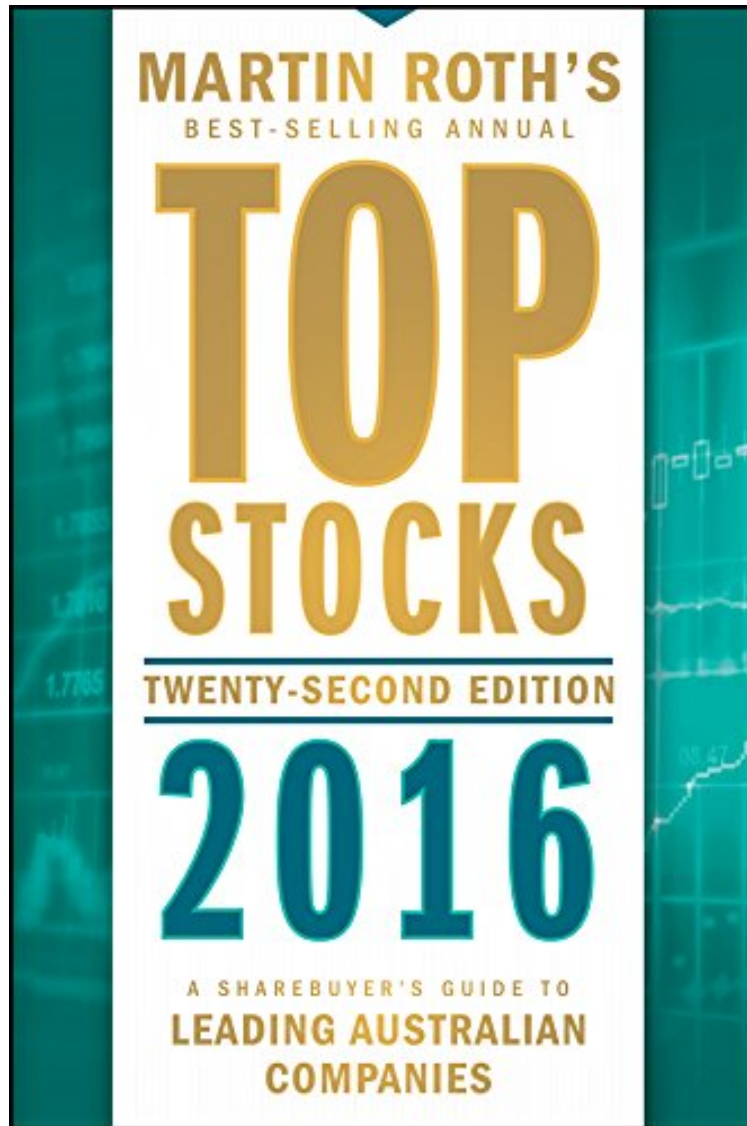

The Best Share Resource I Buy Every Year By James N Simpson I've been reading each year's edition of this book for probably about the last ten years and it is easily my number one resource to know what shares to research further and purchase and sometimes even to sell. Martin Roth lists companies which he's evaluated to be pretty financially secure and have strong outlooks for the following year. Of course there's still risk but the beauty of this book is that if you're investments aren't in this book, it's a nice prompt to have a closer look as to if you should keep your shares or offload them. Martin Roth lists the companies that were in last year's book that no longer qualify to be in this one. It also allows you to discover companies you might know the products or services of, but have never heard of before. If you click on the company info link for a share on Commsec or other online trading sites, this provides a similar analysis on the actual companies listed in here. Unless you know to look at a particular stock you're not always going to know about it, unless you have the time to click on every single ASX listed company link so that's basically the value of this book, it provides you suggestions to do further research. Also if you read AFR Smart Investor lift out magazine that comes out once a month in the Financial Review newspaper, this is similar to the snapshots and similar pages where individual companies are looked at but with a lot more information and text on each company. Martin Roth hasn't based selection of stock in this book on percentage of money you get back in dividends (although one of his criteria to make the cut is that the company must pay a dividend), instead Roth uses a set of strict criteria to analyse all the companies on the stock exchange, such as debt level, benchmarks of profitability and other stuff your average guy in the street probably doesn't fully understand or even understand at all. Share price of each company is irrelevant to a company being listed here, as it should be since they often go up and down dramatically throughout a year. Although he does list the current share price at the time of publication which although the title is Top Stocks 2016, was actually October 2015 ( lists a December date for the US, which is why all I can review here is the Kindle edition). This means Top Stocks 2016 is a bit out of date the longer you move away from that publication date. There are graphs showing the price of a share over a twelve month cycle so you can see at a glance if a share is trading at a rate below its average. You still need to do a bit of research with current announcements and stuff like this to make sure you're not buying something that has suddenly turned bad but this book provides some great suggestions. Twenty one companies from last years edition didn't make the cut this time round or were taken over by other companies so aren't possible to buy shares in any more since they've been delisted. This edition lists every one of those companies and briefly explains why they aren't on these pages. BHP is the biggest and most well known company to not make the cut. Nineteen new companies though, have made the cut this year, some have been in prior editions to last years edition. The biggest and most well known company to make the book's cut this year is Coca Cola Amatil. So if you put off buying these for every couple of years, you might have to make a decision to buy this years due to the sheer number of changes to who's on the pages. Don't forget it's tax deductible from your dividend income.
